

Statutes for the Nordic Federation of Young Obstetricians and Gynaecologists.

- § 1. Nordic Federation of Young Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (NFYOG), is an association of the national societies (FUGO, Norway; OGU, Sweden; FYGO, Denmark; EGO, Finland and representatives for similar societies in Iceland, which organizes trainees in obstetrics and gynaecology and younger specialists in the field. NFYOG is a fraction of and closely related to Nordic Federation of Societies of Obstetrics and Gynaecologists (NFOG).
The domicile for the organisation is connected to the treasurer.
- § 2. The purpose of the association is to encourage the collaboration between trainees and young obstetricians and gynaecologists in the Nordic countries and to work for a good education in the speciality.
The purpose with a closer Nordic collaboration is to gain inspiration and exchange experiences in matters regarding training.
Furthermore, in relation to the work in international organisations, one can make the Nordic collaboration a starting point.
- § 3. The board of the association consists of up to two representatives from each Nordic country, each nominated by their respective national societies.
The aim is that the two representatives are the chairman and the national ENTOG-representative from their respective national societies.
- § 4. The board constitutes itself. The chairperson and treasurer are elected for a period of two years.
Re-election can take place only once. It is aimed that the post as a chairperson alternates between the countries
If the board finds it necessary, it is possible to constitute on other posts .The chairperson is responsible for summoning and leading the board meetings.
Board meetings are alternating between the countries and will typically take place twice a year. The minutes are taken by the host country.
It is aimed to arrange board meetings in relation to ENTOG council's meetings and the NFOG congress.
- § 5. The economy of the association is based on contributions from NFOG, sponsors etc. There is no subscription; but if the association not have the means to cover the board expenses, then each country cover for their own representatives' expenses in relation to the board work.
The association has an account in a bank in the country of the treasurer. The chairperson is responsible for the association financially.
The chairperson and the treasurer are signatories of the association's bank account.
The consecutive financial records are presented to the board.

- § 6. The treasurer of NFOG audits the accounts on a yearly basis. The account year follows the calendar year, and the accounts are forwarded to NFOG by April 1st the following year.
- § 7. The National representatives can for shorter or longer periods of time refrain from participation in the work of NFYOG.
The association is considered dissolved if less than three countries are represented in the continued work. In this case any assets of the association will be transferred to NFOG.
- § 8. Changing these statutes requires agreement from the boards of the respective national societies.
